Introduction

Welcome to the 22^{nd} Scandinavian Sarcoma Group Working Committee Meeting in Malmø 2018. As usual all working committees have their own program and will discuss comprehensively selected topics. On Tuesday afternoon the Visceral and retroperitoneal sarcoma working group will have their own meeting (as previous years).

At the General assembly Monday morning there will be no election this year, but the coming election on WGM December 2018 will be discussed. New chairman, secretary and treasurer are to be elected December 2018. The SSGs meetings in the future are important tasks that will be discussed.

Results of SSG XX, the adjuvant STS trial will be presented. Due to abstract for CTOS, November 2017, a presentation of data at the SSG 38th Plenary Meeting in Aarhus, September 2017, could not be presented.

As previous years a project (AYA project) using the data of the Central register will be given.

Other tasks on the agenda are imaging diagnostics of soft tissue sarcoma and the updated version of the ESMO guidelines.

Our colleagues from Bergen will inform us about the program for the 40 years Jubilee Meeting (39th SSG Plenary Meeting) in Bergen May 8-10, 2019. Deadline for abstracts March 1st, 2019.

Notably, our Scandinavian multidisciplinary cooperation is central in maintaining a high quality of diagnosis, treatment and follow-up of patients with bone- and soft tissue sarcoma. We should therefore strengthen such cooperation in the future.

As we are always trying to synchronize our treatment strategies, why not synchronize our:

- 1. Regimes and principles before and after.
- 2. Information to patients and families.
- 3. Information to authorities.
- Local tumor control in Ewing sarcoma: surgery and/or radiotherapy?
- Surgical treatment vs radiotherapy in Ewing sarcoma of scapula.
- Rationale of non-surgical treatment in metastatic bone lesions.
- Bone reconstruction with pretreatment of autograft can be done in various ways, both in handling (cryoradio-or autoclave) and with different timeframes: Can we find a common solution – i.e. guidelines?
- Has the discrepancy in size of STS between imaging and specimen clinical relevance in life expectancy?
- What do we know for sure about intra-operative ST tumor rupture!
 - What does it mean?
 - does it affect the treatment schedule?
 - does it affect life expectancy?
- How reliable is post-chemo reduction in tumor zone as a reference for save surgical margin?
- Case reports from colleagues that have been presented and discussed through the Internet!
