Finally, we can present our program for our upcoming course in bone sarcoma pathology with well-known experts in the field! We look forward to welcoming you in Oslo for a two-day course.

The venue is “The Hub” (Clarion Hotel) in the city center. Because of a generous donation from the Bardo Foundation (<https://www.thebardofoundation.org/>), the course is free of charge, including lunch both days.

Bone sarcomas are rare and the diagnostics are challenging, requiring collaboration, both on an individual hospital level and across borders. In Scandinavia, we already have a well-developed collaboration between pathologists, with regular meetings around the microscope. We have planned this course with the aim to further broaden our knowledge, share experience and discuss difficult and challenging cases with international experts in the field.

As you can see from the attached program, we will cover a broad spectrum within bone pathology, including molecular pathology, radiology and clinical aspects. The course is intended for sarcoma pathologists and for residents with some experience in the sarcoma field.
